This wonderful 16-Day-Tour will take us on an exciting Corvette Road-Trip to our **13**th **Sports Cars Season Opening** in Austria and through beautiful Italy where we visit the factories and museums of major Italian car manufacturers and participate in the Maranello FERRARI Celebration "Notte Rossa".

You will arrive at Munich Airport, Germany, on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 3rd</u> where I will pick you all up and bring you to the nice "Best Western PLUS Hotel ERB" for your first night, where you meet the other participants of the tour.









Until it is time for dinner and while we are picking up the other participants and the Corvettes you can relax from the long flight, enjoy the "Almdorf SPA" with 5 different saunas and a steam bath, go shopping in the many nearby outlet stores in "Parsdorf City" or have lunch or a drink at the hotel restaurant or bar.









We will pick you up at **7 PM** to visit our friends Eleonora & Giuseppe's fine and authentic Italian "Ristorante Modesto's" and enjoy a wonderful dinner as a foretaste of 10 wonderful days in Bella Italia













On <u>Thursday</u>, <u>June 4th</u>, after a relaxed breakfast we will "saddle our horses" and leave "Hotel Erb" at **10:30 AM** to the service and rest station Vaterstetten on Autobahn A99 direction South where we will meet some other sports cars and their drivers and co-drivers who will accompany us on our way to the wonderful *Hotel Schönruh***** in Gerlos.



The caravan will follow the Autobahn to exit Holzkirchen from where we will drive nice country roads through Tegernsee or Bad Tölz and the Sylvenstein reservoir lake along Lake Achensee and the Achenpass to Tyrol, Austria. We will drive up the mountain pass road to the lovely village Gerlos in the fantastic mountain scenery of the Zillertal.

















The Hotel Schönruh**** will welcome us and our Corvettes and all other sports cars in their 3 garages and carports.

The owners Elfi & Franz and their son Manuel and daughter in law Sandra and the whole staff are prepared for us and can't wait to arrange a wonderful weekend for us. The following 2 daily tours will be leaded and guided by the hosts.









We will arrive in the early afternoon where the hotel staff already await us with a welcome drink and snack buffet, where we meet the other sports cars drivers who came separately from other directions. After moving into our beautiful rooms we can enjoy the pool and SPA facilities or relax at their lovely terrace or hotel bar.









The planned daily trips for <u>Friday</u>, <u>June 5th</u> and <u>Saturday</u>, <u>June 6th</u> are not fixed yet but will be great tours to very beautiful and interesting places with breathtaking views – as every year.









On Friday evening at 7 PM we let it rip and rock and roll at our "Sports Cars Black & White Dinner & Party" with dinner, music and dancing - we therefore ask every participant to bring black and/or white clothes with you © © ©





On Saturday evening we will enjoy a romantic BBQ evening with a smoker grill on the Schönruh terrace









On <u>Sunday, June 7th</u>, we either have a "day off" and enjoy the hotel's amenities, walk the nice Gerlos town or take the gondola (cable car) up the mountains and enjoy a great mountain lodge lunch with a breathtaking view.

We can also make a shorter excursion together with our Corvettes and drive 35 km down the Gerlos Pass road to Bramberg at Wildkogel, where we take the Smaragdbahn gondola up to the mountain station at 2,101 m.

While the more relaxed ones among us make themselves comfortable at the Wildkogelalm Restaurant or go on a short hike to the lakes, the racers and adrenaline junkies among us grab their mountain carts and embark on a fun, fast-paced and unforgettable ride down. Right at the mountain station of the Smaragdbahn gondola station you really get going: the winding mountain cart route is a really fun summer experience. On the approx. 4 kilometers to the middle station at 1.624 m, the all-terrain, three-wheeled carts provide the right drive. Great fun that you can't get enough of - repeat rides are inevitable! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=lnOXVwSvDDI By the way, helmets are compulsory on the mountain carts – rental helmets are provided at the start – and the carts have brakes – and we have feet....



















On Monday, June 8th, after a hearty and relaxing breakfast at the sparkling wine breakfast buffet, we check out and say Good-Bye to everyone who has to go home as our journey goes on for another fantastic 10 days ©

We will leave the hotel at around **11 AM** to drive one of the most famous and most spectacular mountain roads in the world, the **Grossglockner High Alpine Road**, which is around 120 km away from Hotel Schönruh.

The 48 km long **Grossglockner High Alpine Road** is the highest surfaced mountain pass road in Austria. It connects Bruck in the state of Salzburg with Heiligenblut in Carinthia via Fuscher Törl and Hochtor Pass at 2,504 meters (8,215 ft). The road is named after the Grossglockner, Austria's highest mountain. Built as a scenic road, a toll is assessed for passage. This alpine road is one of the highest driving pleasures worldwide – every kilometer and every single one of the 36 turns is a treat for car and mountain lovers ©







The Grossglockner is, at 3,798 meters (12,461 ft) above the Adriatic, the highest mountain in Austria and the highest mountain in the Alps east of the Brenner Pass. The Pasterze, Austria's most extended glacier, lies on the Grossglockner's eastern slope. We will make a break at Europe's highest restaurant, Kaiser-Franz-Joseph-Haus.









After lunch break we will continue to follow the Grossglockner High Alpine Road direction Italy and check in to the authentic mountain lodge hotel "Gailberghöhe" on our way to Bella Italia, where we also will enjoy a nice dinner.







On <u>Tuesday, June 9th</u>, after breakfast at "Gailberghöhe", we will drive the beautiful curvy (and bumpy) country pass road of the Plöckenpass and enter the highway in Tolmezzo which we drive via Udine to the Adriatic coast of Bella Italia where we will stay at the wonderful beach hotel "Casa Bianca al Mare" in Lido di Jesolo for the next 3 nights.







Here we will recover from the strains of mountain driving and let us go really well. We will only eat and drink and swim and relax and do the best for ourselves – and certainly will have a lot of fun !!! © © ©

At **7 PM** we will all meet in the lobby and walk 190 ft. to the nice and good "Ristorante Pizzeria Gustéo" for dinner.









The next day – Wednesday, June 10th – is completely at your disposal. You can either take a walk through the lovely village of Jesolo and go shopping or relax at the beach or pool – or pool bar. ◎ ◎ ◎

We'll meet again in the lobby at **6:45 PM** and walk just a few minutes to a great funny dinner place called COCORICO.







On <u>Thursday, June 11th</u>, after an early breakfast we will leave the hotel at **7:30 AM** and take the public bus to Jesolo Harbor Punta Sabbioni, where we will take a 1-hour boat trip at **9.15 AM** to Piazza San Marco in Downtown Venice.





Venice will be one of the highlights of our whole tour. Welcome to the glorious, incomparable city of Venice, Italy. With its grand marble palaces and churches seeming to float atop the city's many canals, and boasting the world's most artistic masterpieces per square mile, this city will amaze you in every way.

At **10.30 AM** we will meet bella Luisella – our private Englisch speaking tour guide – who was born in Venice and knows the city inside and out. She will show us all the attractions and point of interests of Venice and tell us everything about the history of the lagoon city. After the guided walking tour through the City of Venice we will hop on a gondola, or do as the locals do and take a Vaporetto along Venice's fabled Grand Canal. Our guide will point out the architectural wonders as we glide along from the Rialto Bridge to Doge's Palace and Piazza San Marco. Make sure to go inside the Basilica di San Marco, one of the most spectacular houses of worship in the world.

























Everybody who wants to can have lunch or coffee, cake and ice cream or a drink in one of the many restaurants, cafés and bars of the city. The early afternoon is at your disposal.









After a splendid time in Venice we will close the day with a late lunch/early dinner at **3:30 PM** in one of the nice authentic Venetian restaurants which is close to the gate where our boat back to Punta Sabbioni is leaving at **6 PM**.











We will close the evening with a satisfying "nightcap" on our beautiful waterfront terrace.

On <u>Friday, June 12th</u> we will have a long way to drive (around 260 km) to the Modena area so we will leave the beautiful "Casa Bianca al Mare" early at **8:30 AM**. On our way after ≈190 km we will stop in Funo to see the interesting Ferruccio Lamborghini Museum. A very personal museum run by Ferruccio Lamborghini's son Tonino Lamborghini. The exhibits are impressive. From the tractors and first cars with which Lamborghini started in the post-war period up to the 1980s, through to the family history and the industrial history associated with the company, many photos and the contemporary means of transport of the Lamborghini family are shown.









Afterwards we drive 25 km to Sant'Agata Bolognese, where we will have a personal English speaking LAMBORGHINI factory tour at **2 PM** with a walk through one of the production halls and assembly line where we either watch the live making of the URUS, the Hybrid REVUELTO and/or the TEMERARIO (the new HURACAN successor) – and we will visit the Lamborghini Museum. Before we get there we will have a lunch break at the "BULL BAR" across the factory.























After this interesting experience we continue our drive for another 45 km to Maranello, the birth city of Ferrari where we will check-in to the beautifully restored "Villa Maranello" for the next 3 nights - a nice small old Villa in Downtown Maranello and a former residency of young Signore Enzo Ferrari.







At **7 PM** after a long day drive we will jump in reserved taxis who bring us to the – known only by locals – fabulous Ristorante "Il Piccolo Mugnaio" in Torre Maina for a nice and authentic outback dinner in an old romantic mill - a very natural place to enjoy and have fun – where we sit in the middle of the kitchen while Mamma is cooking and her daughters are serving. And believe me: a taxi will be needed after Mamma's wonderful tasty Limoncello..... ③ ③ ③









On <u>Saturday</u>, <u>June 13th</u> we will leave the Villa at **9 AM** and drive 24 km to San Cesario sul Penaro, where will enjoy an English guided tour through the fascinating factory of PAGANI Automobili at **10 AM**. Pagani is a small volume manufacturer of one of the most expensive 12-cylinder sports cars worldwide (the "cheapest" starts at >3 Million \$).

"....so everything had to come together as if it was a car carved out of a block of Carrara marble...." said Horacio Pagani about his first project, the ZONDA. His newest dream car is the UTOPIA. With a lot of luck we might even see Signore Horacio Pagani himself.



















After this great and exciting experience we return to our lovely Villa Maranello, park our Corvettes and have a little lunch break in one of the many places in Maranello. Right across our villa is the very nice "Caffè dell'Orologio" with a great selection of little tasty things – open till **1 PM** for lunch and then again from **3:30 PM**.














In the afternoon we walk a few meters to the famous "Galleria Ferrari", the world-renowned Ferrari Museum and Store in the birthplace of the great sports and race car. And we can visit the Ferrari Flagship store. The museum is open until midnight that day so everyone can decide which is the best time for visiting the museum.



We will probably wonder why there are so many Ferrari driving and standing everywhere in Maranello, but there is a reason for that - today is the "Notte Rossa" - the biggest Ferrari event in Maranello. From **4 PM** the streets are closed to "normal" traffic in the city center and only Ferraris are allowed to drive and will line up right in front of our hotel later in the evening. At **6 PM** the real party starts and you can walk through the entire Ferrari factory grounds until **10 PM**. There's also music and party and food & drink places everywhere and all restaurants are open.



If they are open at the Notte Rossa (normally they are closed on Saturdays and Sundays) we will walk less than a mile to the restaurant of "Mamma Rosella" - Ristorante Montana - behind Ferrari's Fiorano Race Track, where we will have a wonderful dinner at **7:30 PM** – it is **THE** hangout of every Formula 1 driver and was the favorite restaurant of famous F1 world champion Michael Schumacher, who won the world championship 7 times, 5 of them with Ferrari.



On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 14th</u> after a long and exciting Ferrari night we drive to Modena where we will have an English guided tour through the great "Ferrari Museo and Casa Enzo" at **11 AM**.

























After the nice museum visit we will drive 20 km to Magreta where we will visit the wonderful "Acienda Agricola Acetaia Leonardi Giovanni", a traditional "Aceto Balsamico di Modena" (also called the liquid gold) vinegar factory, where we will have an English guided tour through the factory and enjoy a nice "Taste of Modena" lunch with typical local delicacies and balsamic vinegar tasting at **1:30 PM**.











Freshly strengthened with culinary delights, we drive only 6 km to the unique "Collezione UMBERTO PANINI Motor Museum" - a beautiful small private museum which contains a collection of Maserati heritage — a century of speed, raw power, and refined design.

The core of the automobile collection is Maserati History: 19 of the finest cars Italy has ever produced. Umberto Panini, a Modena native and the patriarch of the family famed for their collectible empire, purchased the collection before it went to auction in 1996, housing the cars after many years at the former family farm Hombre now in a brand new facility close to the Race Circuit Autodromo di Modena.









If you are still in the mood for another museum we can drive another 13 km to the private house and now museum of the world famous Italian Opera Maestro Luciano Pavarotti – the "Casa Luciano Pavarotti". Explore the private home Pavarotti built in his beloved hometown, transformed by the Pavarotti Foundation into a museum housing his exceptional collection of personal items, unseen memorabilia, costumes and awards gathered throughout his artistic career. Luciano Pavarotti lived and died in this house.













Anyone who is still hungry can stop for a pizza at "Pizzeria L'Incontro", a 3 minute walk from the Villa or we can spend the evening together with some drinks and snacks in the garden of the villa. A grocery store (CONAD) where you can find everything for a nice evening snack is right across and is open from Monday to Saturday 7 AM to 8 PM (closed on Sunday). The evening is at your disposal.

On Monday, June 15th, if the MASERATI Factory is open (it was closed for 2 years due to renovation works and is supposed to reopen in late 2025/early 2026) we may drive 25 km to MASERATI S.P.A. in Modena for another great factory tour at 2.30 PM. The starting-point for this journey is the historic plant on Viale Ciro Menotti in Modena. The Modena plant, where the Trident has had its home for over 80 years, is a magical location that combines the Brand's "made in Italy" DNA and its Heritage with an irrepressible drive towards the future and innovation: the plant has been modernised with new production, engine assembly and painting facilities specifically for the MC20. Lasting about an hour, the exclusive factory tour includes a welcome reception and historical introduction in their showrooms prior to a guided walk through the assembly line and the powertrain department. Afterwards there might be the opportunity to view some cars and browse through the Maserati store.

















If we go to MASERATI or not, we will start our engines and drive around 130 km (from Maserati) or 155 km (from Maranello) to wonderful Lake Garda and the lovely peninsula village Sirmione with its historical Scaliero Castle "Castello Scagliero". It is a fortress from the Scaliger era, an access point to the historical center of Sirmione and one of the most complete and well-conserved castles of Italy. We will stop for a lunch break somewhere on the way.












To reach our nice hotel we need to <u>drive in a convoy over the drawbridge of the fortress and the pedestrian zone</u> <u>through the old town of Sirmione</u> where all locals and visitors of Sirmione can salute our Vettes. Italians love the sound of loud exhausts and burnouts,not sure if tourists also do.... I strongly doubt German tourists will do ;-) This is such a powerful experience full of pure adrenaline and joy ©



We will move in to the beautiful 4**** Hotel "Olivi Thermae & Natural Spa" just behind the old town of Sirmione (the old town is within 10 minutes walking distance) where we will spend 2 nights. The hotel has excellent reviews, a very good location overlooking Lake Garda and has a pool and SPA area and nice air conditioned lake view balcony rooms.

The Hotel "Olivi Thermae & Natural Spa" is one of the few hotels with its own private car parking lot. Most other hotels in the old town area offer their guests only parking spaces in the city's public car parking lots.







If we are early enough in Sirmione - between 3 PM and 4 PM – we can explore the village, go shopping, have coffee and ice cream, make a boat trip or use the SPA area of the hotel before dinner. The afternoon is at your disposal.















We will have dinner either in one of the many restaurants at the pier of Sirmione, at the funny "Birreria & Hamburgeria II Vicolo" (if we can get a reservation there) or at the nice restaurant "Vista Lago" on our way back to Hotel Olivi.











On <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>June 16th</u>, is completely at your disposal. If we are lucky, the <u>Mille Miglia</u> will pass by (date and route is not released yet). You can relax at the pool or Spa, go shopping or discover Sirmione and the castle - or you can walk to Sirmione harbor pier and take a ferry boat to lovely Bardolino, a lively wine town on the Olive Riviera of Lake Garda.

Thanks to the light, sparkling red wine, the small town of **Bardolino** is on everyone's lips. It grows in the hilly hinterland of the former fishing village, which today exudes a rather urban atmosphere. The open old town with its wide streets, numerous shops and long promenade invite you to stroll. We will have a nice lunch break in one of their outside seating restaurants or cafés and enjoy a refreshing glass of Bardolino or some ice-cream.







After a nice stay in Bardolino we again hop on a boat in the afternoon and go either to Garda or Lazise - both are wonderful romantic fishing villages with a historic old town.

Garda is located between the huge rock Rocca and the very beautiful peninsula San Vigilio. A very beautiful and varied vegetation is native to the Bay of Garda. Cypresses, olive trees, myrtle and also oleanders grow here. Garda has many romantic corners, but also the bustle in the city center. During the Roman period, the place was called the "pearl" of the lake. The Lake Garda is named after the city of Garda.

Lazise is a picturesque small town on the south-eastern shore of Lake Garda, which harmoniously combines history and the present. The old city wall with all its towers and gates surrounds Lazise like a protective wall. And right in the middle, squares and narrow alleys leave enough space to offer the wide promenade enough space to the beach.









After a relaxing day at the pool or an exciting sightseeing or shopping day we will meet in the hotel lobby at **7:15 PM** and walk together to the beautiful Ristorante "L'Arcimboldo" in Downtown Sirmione - a nice place with very good and authentic Italian food - just a 5-minute walk away from our hotel, where we will have dinner at **7:30 PM**. If the weather is nice and warm we certainly will dine at their lovely waterfront terrace.









On <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 17th</u>, after a relaxed breakfast on the lovely terrace of Hotel Olivi we will drive the breathtaking scenic road along Lake Garda direction North (Riva del Garda) through the romantic fishing villages Peschiera del Garda, Bardolino, Lazise, Garda, Torri del Benaco and Malcesine. On our wonderful curvy ride along the lake we will stop at the hip bar and gelateria "Barino 2.0" in Brenzone for a little relaxing waterfront coffee or ice cream break.

















In Rovereto Sud (South) we will enter the Autostrada A22 and follow it 240 km to Sterzing, the last Italian city before the Italian-Austrian border Brennero.

We will spend our last night in Italy at the beautiful and hip "Steindl's Boutique Hotel" in Sterzing and enjoy a great dinner in the guestroom or on the nice terrasse of the authentic South Tyrolean restaurant "Kolping Haus".















On <u>Thursday, June 18th</u> after a wonderful long breakfast we will go back to Munich where we check-in to the Hotel "Alter Hof" for your last night in Europe.



General Terms and Conditions

1. Services / Performance

Palm Island Car Tours (hereinafter referred to as PICT) organizes guided adventure tours and road trips for self-drivers with rented sports cars - mostly of the Chevrolet Corvette brand - as well as for travelers with their own vehicle. The scope of the services is described in detail in the offer brochure. PICT reserves the right of changes to individual travel services, which become necessary after conclusion of the travel contract and do not question the overall character of the trip. PICT endeavors to allocate the provided vehicles according to the wishes of the traveler, however a claim to a certain vehicle does not exist.

2. Minimum/maximum age requirements and restrictions

Participants driving a highly motorized rental vehicle - provided by PICT - themselves must be at least 30 years of age and in possession of an EU recognized car drivers license for at least ten years when the tour starts. An IDP (International Driving Permit) is required in most EU countries. If the participant is older than 75 years, he needs a medical certificate that he is healthy enough to undertake the tour. The maximum age for renting a highly motorized rental car (Corvette) is <u>82 years</u>. No age restrictions with own car.

3. Registration / Payment

By registering, the travel participant concludes a travel contract with PICT for himself as well as all listed fellow travelers. The contract is concluded with the acceptance by PICT. Upon conclusion of the contract PICT hands out the travel confirmation to the travel participant. Upon registration, a deposit must be paid, the remaining travel price must be received by PICT no later than six weeks prior to departure. The terms of deposit and final payment are given to the travel participant with the registration.

4. Liability of the tour operator

PICT is liable for the correctness of the stated travel services as well as a conscientious travel handling. Transportation with external service providers (e.g., bus, train, taxi) is subject to the conditions of the respective carrier. In the event of cancellation of a journey due to Force Majeure, PICT retains the right to appropriate compensation for services already provided or necessary for the travel conditions. The contractual liability of PICT for damages, which are not personal injury, is limited to three times the travel price, as far as a damage of the traveler is neither intentionally nor grossly negligently caused or as far as PICT is responsible for a damage to the traveler because of a fault of a service provider. This maximum liability is valid per traveler and journey. PICT is not liable for damages caused intentionally or grossly negligently by the travel participant. PICT is also not liable for any performance disturbances in connection with services that are merely provided as third-party services and that are expressly indicated in the travel advertisement as a third-party service. A claim for damages against PICT is excluded. If PICT is a service provider in other cases, PICT shall be liable in accordance with the provisions applicable to it. The participant is obliged to assist in the event of performance disruptions in order to avoid or minimize any possible damage. In particular, the traveler is obliged to report his complaints immediately to the organizer. He is obliged to provide remedies, if possible. If the traveler culpably fails to report a deficiency, the right to reduction does not apply.

5. Liability of the tour participant

The traveler participates on the journey at his own risk. He is instructed in the handling of the vehicles and is responsible for compliance with the Highway Code and all legal requirements. The traveler is liable for self-inflicted accident and other damage to PICT mediated vehicles up to the amount of excess EURO 5,000 (ca. USD 5,500) per claim. The participant is liable without limitation if he caused the damage by intent or gross negligence or if the damage was caused by alcohol or drug-related unfit driving, in case of accident or proven improper handling of the mediated by PICT vehicle.

6. Cancellation / rebooking of the client

PICT insists on the conclusion of a travel cancellation insurance - see <u>9</u>. Insurance. The cancellation fees vary depending on the length, type and destination/route of the trip, so please refer to the respective offer brochure. **By signing up for a tour the participant agrees to PICT's terms & conditions.** The resigned participant is at liberty to prove that PICT did not incur any damage or a significantly lower damage than the lump sum demanded by him. The travel participant may request that a third party (substitute) enter into the rights and obligations of the travel contract. PICT can only object to the change in the person if there are important reasons (for example, lack of availability of two single rooms instead of a double room). A refund for unused services is not provided, this applies in particular to the untimely arrival at the start of the journey or for early departure. In this case, PICT reserves the right to charge separately for any additional expenses (for example, for an additional lodging or transfer).

7. Cancellation of the tour organizer

PICT may terminate the travel contract without notice, if the journey is permanently disturbed by the travel participant or if a permanent improper treatment of the vehicles brokered by PICT is detected. Any additional costs for the return journey shall be borne by the excluded traveler. PICT retains the right to the travel price with deduction of saved travel expenses. PICT shall be entitled to terminate a travel contract up to 4 weeks prior to departure, if its execution is unreasonable for PICT after exhausting all possibilities, because the costs incurred in the event of execution exceed the economic limit of the victim's travel costs, if PICT is not responsible for the circumstances leading to the cancellation and proves the circumstances. If the trip is cancelled for this reason, without the traveler claiming the alternative service, he will receive the paid travel price back immediately. PICT is also entitled to cancel the trip up to 6 weeks prior to departure and refund the deposits received if the required minimum number of participants is not reached due to customer cancellations or too few registrations and the cost-effectiveness is therefore no longer given.

8. Safety

The PICT routes are carefully selected routes that usually take place on minor roads. Sections with higher traffic such as highways are possible and depending on travel route also necessary. The vehicles used by PICT are regularly maintained and are in excellent technical conditions. They comply with all legal regulations in all aspects. The tour operator strives to carry out the PICT tours to the complete satisfaction of the participants. The presence at the instruction for the use of the vehicles is obligatory for all participants, who drive one thru PICT provided vehicle. All Instructions given by the tour management to the participants are binding.

9. Insurance

Included in the travel price is the motor vehicle liability insurance, a fully comprehensive insurance with a deductible of EURO 5,000 (ca. USD 5,500). In case of damage, the tour guide must be informed immediately. The conditions of the insurance contract can be viewed by the travel participant at PICT. The travel price does not include a baggage, medical, rental car damage protector and cancellation insurance.

All participants <u>MUST</u> buy a comprehensive travel insurance policy before leaving for the tour. The insurance should include covering of medical/dental, personal effects, cancellations for any reason and rental vehicle excess.

10. General provisions

Claims against PICT must be made in writing no later than one month after the end of the trip at the registered office of the organizer. After expiry of the period, the participant may only assert claims if he has been prevented from observing the deadline without fault. Contractual claims for damages become time-barred after two years. PICT informs the nationals of the state in which the travel is offered about travel, passport, visa and health regulations as well as their possible changes before departure. The participant is responsible for the observance of all important regulations for the realization of the journey. All disadvantages, in particular the payment of cancellation fees, resulting from the non-compliance with these regulations are at the expense of the customer, unless they are caused by culpable misinformation or noninformation of PICT. All costs not included in the tour price, such as warnings (fines), are indicated separately in the offer brochure. Verbal agreements require the written confirmation to be effective. The participant can sue PICT only at its seat. PICT 's claim against the traveler is governed by the latter' s domicile, unless the action is directed against registered traders or persons who have moved their domicile or habitual residence abroad after the conclusion of the contract or whose domicile or habitual residence is at the time of Action is not known. In these cases, the seat of PICT is authoritative.

11. Ineffectiveness

The ineffectiveness of individual provisions of the travel contract does not result in the ineffectiveness of the entire travel contract.

FAQ

Does the tour include airfare?

No. Most people like to fly with a dedicated airline where they can earn miles - and sometimes people also want to arrive earlier before the tour starts and leave later because they want to travel to other places before or after our tour. There is no point in booking flight tickets for clients – anyone can book as they wish as long as they arrive before the tour starts.

In which city and European Country does the tour start and where does it end?

The tour officially starts and ends in Munich, Germany. On the arrival day (date of the tour start) there will be a dinner where we will meet everyone for the first time and have an important tour briefing with all traffic rules and restrictions in Germany, Austria and Italy. Please stay and listen closely to the instructions.

What should I bring?

A travel light and/or a flashlight wouldn't be bad. Also, if you need a washing cloth you should bring it – this is not common in most European counties. Since we do not exactly know in advance which Corvette types (C8 Coupe or Convertible - or if desired also a C7 Coupe) we will get: Please remember that you don't bring more luggage than EASILY fits in the car – don't forget that you might go shopping in Italy. (The trunk and frunk of the C8 coupe and convertible is smaller than the C7 coupe trunk space – C7 Coupe 15 cubic-feet/425 L vs C8 Coupe (European Model) 11.6 cubic-feet/328 L and C8 Convertible 9.4 cubic-feet/266 L).

PLEASE NOTE: NO LUGGAGE VEHICLE WILL ACCOMPANY US!!!

Also bring a warmer jacket (just in case...). There is no dress code anywhere, you can always wear what you like. The tour includes Men and Ladies polo-shirts – please let me know your sizes and colors on the attached registration form.

How's the weather in Germany, Austria and Italy in June?

Usually, the weather in Germany in June is quite nice with an average temperature of around 24°C / 75F. It can be a bit cooler in Austria and the mountain regions, but in Italy the temperature is usually around 28°C / 82F – but it could also be cooler or warmer.....

What are the speed limits in Germany, Austria and Italy?

It depends on which road you are driving... On the German Autobahn (highway) – when there is no speed limit displayed – you can drive as fast as you like. By law slower traffic must stay in the right lane while the left lane is the fast (passing) lane. Driving slowly in the left lane is not allowed. When a speed limit is displayed, it applies to all lanes. The speed limit on a country road in Germany is 100 km/h (62 mph) if there is no special speed limit sign.

In Austria the speed limit on highways is between 100 km/h and 130 km/h – it is displayed in the traffic monitoring system. On country roads the same rules apply as in Germany. Speeding fines are very high compared to Germany.

In Italy, the speed limit on Autostradas (highways) is between 110 km/h and 130 km/h (sometimes even 150 km/h) – it is also displayed in the traffic monitoring system. The speed limit on country roads is 90 km/h (56 mph). Speeding is also very expensive in Italy. Driving in Italy is "narrow", but ok - traffic flows and you'll go with the flow. But they now have Autostrada cameras, so be very careful – speeding is extremely expensive in Italy – more expensive even than in Austria.

Is security an issue in Italy?

Not where we are going. All hotels we stay in and the places we visit are very safe and we won't go to any unsafe places, so don't worry at all. For the rented Corvettes we will have garages or secured or even guarded parking lots everywhere.

BUT: Never leave any personal items like purses, wallets, handbags, cell phones, cameras and other valuables—or things that look like them—visible in the car—this could tempt thieves to smash the windows and break into the cars.

I do not speak German or Italian, how do I get along?

Most Germans, Austrians and Italians speak English, so you won't have problems getting along. I also speak English, German and a little Italian – so we are on the safe side and won't have any problems at all.

Do I need an International Driver License / International Driving Permit (IDP)?

Not in Germany but required in Italy and Austria. You can apply for an International Driving Permit (IDP) for USD 20.00 from AAA or CDN 31.00 from CAA – see links below.
